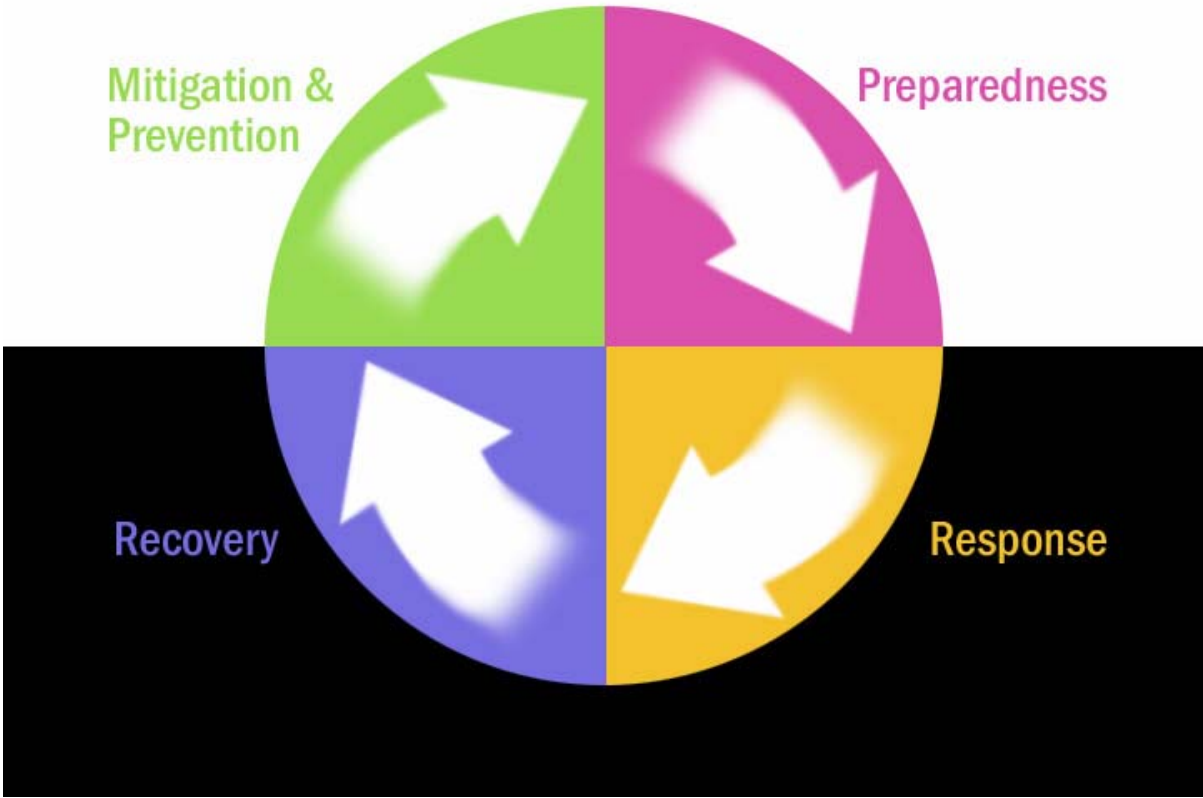

Preparedness



- What is being done on campus?

Communication:

Staff, Parents, Students, Community

Plan in place:

Know the plan, Follow the plan

Supplies:

Additional sanitizing/cleaning supplies purchased

More frequent cleaning/sanitizing in high traffic areas, door knobs, etc.

⇒ Request for donations of additional hand sanitizer and Clorox wipes for student use

Preparedness- Slide 1



- Keep your child at home if the child is ill.
- Have your child visit the doctor if he/she exhibits flu-like symptoms.
- 📞 Call to inform the school that your child will be absent and tell us the nature of your child's illness.
- Children in school who become ill and/or exhibits flu-like symptoms will be isolated from the other students .
- **You will be notified to come and pick up your child.**
- **Please make sure all emergency information is current!**
- We require written verification from your family physician that your child has been tested and does not have H1N1. The form is on the Nativity website. Copies are available in the school office.

Preparedness- *Slide 2*



- In the event that a child is confirmed to have H1N1 the school will be closed for a period of seven (7) days. During that time of quarantine, no employee or student may enter the facility. The entire school will be cleaned according to the directives given by the CDC. All activities scheduled to occur during the seven day period will be cancelled.
- You are strongly encouraged to develop a plan for child care in the event that a school or center is required to close for a period of time.
- Teachers will be required to prepare lesson plans for the seven days to allow the students to continue their work at home. The manner in which the school/center makes these assignments available to the students will vary by location.

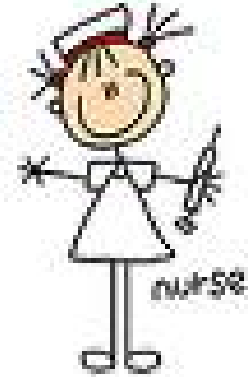
Preparedness- Slide 3



- Example: *If you have a child in NCS, and an older child at Tampa Catholic High School and there is a confirmed case of H1N1 at TC, the younger child will be unable to attend school at NCS until the quarantine has been lifted at the high school.*
- Since the Catholic school facility in a parish may be used by ministries other than Catholic school education, should an individual from another ministry contract H1N1, the school will be forced to close for a seven day period.
- If after a seven days school closure. another case of H1N1 is verified in a school, the school will follow the procedures as listed above.
- In accordance with the CDC directive, this plan will remain in effect for 90 days.

Recover



- Follow the doctor's orders. Get well.
