2018-2019 RECOMMENDED SUMMER LEARNING


To continue skill-building during the summer, below are the recommended activities for your child, tailored to grade level.

Reading/Writing:

- Read 20 minutes daily. After reading with your child, pose questions that have them reflect on the story.
 - What was happening in the story? How do you know?
 - What was your favorite part of the story? Why?
 - Ask your child to make a prediction about what they think will happen next in the story.
 - Did anyone in the story show God's love or model Jesus?

We will also be participating in the Sunshine State Young Readers Program next school year as we continue to prepare and inspire our students academically. The purpose of the SSYRA Program is to encourage students to read independently for pleasure and to read books that are on, above, and below their reading level in order to improve their reading fluency.

We are including the list of K-2 books for your reference (the 2018-2019 list isn't out yet, so we provided last year's as a resource and will share the K-2 list as soon as it is available) so that students can begin reading them over the summer. We will have a classroom copy of each book available next school year for students to check out within their classrooms, but we highly recommend picking a minimum of 3 books off the list to read over the summer. The titles are available at local public libraries as well as online or in book stores.
